In the past year we have seen a 300% increase in requests to the Mission from churches with all sorts of needs. I have created some Excel tools to track the flow of these requests...some revitalizations, some closures, some interim situations. For churches that need revitalization, we follow a process of gathering information, meeting with them to assess the needs, and then we deliver the plan to the church. Each plan ends up being unique and the church decides if they want to implement it themselves or want us to walk alongside them as they work on the plan.

I have entered a couple of local church revitalization processes with our president Jon Jenks which has included the evaluation meetings and setting of plans all to head the church toward healthy reproduction. I am thankful for these opportunities for problem solving and have enjoyed serving in this way. Jon has been gracious to not allow these involvements to require much more than attending meetings and depositing a cent or two here and there. I am thankful for the past experiences in church ministry that the Lord has brought me through and the ability to use them for Him is a joy.

The executive administration is exploring how best to grow our team to meet the continuing growing needs of churches. This has led to adding Eric Nihart to the team. In January he began as our VP of Advancement. He lives in the central Iowa area and is working remotely with BCP. The most recent Connect that just came out gives an overview of Eric's biographical information and role and responsibilities. We are looking forward to what he will add to BCP.



One additional task that has come back to my plate is walking with the new missionaries as they journey through support raising. I have been meeting with Stephen and Janelle Jespersen and assisting Yunior and Marilyn Gonzalez (through interpreter Shawn Haynie) to work though the candidate training schedule. Both families are progressing forward well and God is doing great things!



Yunior and Marilyn Gonzalez are from Cuba and were involved in church ministry there until 2020. Yunior was trained by his pastor in missionary work and assisted in starting four churches, two of which are still open today in Cuba. He completed seminary training and served as pastor as well as seminary professor there until February 2020 when he traveled to the U.S. They are now serving at Iglesia
