Our youth leader recently shared some devastating news with our middle school boys. SB, a boy who had been living with a foster family from our church for the past year, was suddenly being moved. The boys were crushed and immediately turned to prayer, pouring out their hearts to God. SB was scheduled for baptism the following week, so we organized an impromptu baptism service and the entire church committed to fasting and praying for him.

In a miraculous turn of events, Tim and Susan Heinrich were able to be emergency-licensed as foster parents in less than 24 hours, preventing SB from being sent to a group home. He is now living with them until his original foster situation can be resolved. For those familiar with the foster care system, you know this process typically takes weeks or months—God truly moved mountains to make this possible. We continue to pray for a swift resolution so he can return to his foster family soon. In the meantime, Tim and Susan are blessed to have this 14-year-old boy in their home.

"We should pray and fast more often" was the refrain at Crossroads Baptist Church this past month. Will you join them in praying for God's continued blessing this month as they prepare to host VBS?

They are praying for 6 new families to join the church, and in light of the recent Mother's Day holiday, will you join them in praying for the salvation of 5 wives and mothers? Their names are Joanna, Windi, Tami, Danita, and Marie.
