Here's Just What You Need!

So often we think our ability to speak is what convinces a person to believe the gospel. Moses had that problem. In chapter six of Exodus, he tells God basically this. "I went to the Israelites with your message of deliverance from Egypt, and they didn't believe me. I also went to Pharaoh, and he didn't believe me." Moses uses the words "I have uncircumcised lips." That means he was not eloquent in speech. Moses used that same statement earlier when arguing with God about being the leader of Israel.

Without doubt in my mind, Moses may have had a speech impediment or just wasn't good speaking off the cuff. His statement and argument were probably true. The problem was this: it wasn't going to be Moses' speech that changed Pharaoh's mind. It was going to be the power of God alone. Moses was just the mouth for God telling Pharaoh what would be next if he didn't obey the God of Israel.

The story is told of a simple man in Johnson City, NY, who had one simple act, and that was picking up kids in his old van and taking them to church. One of those kids was Jim Jeremiah who came to Christ and later served Christ in churches and as president of Cedarville University. His son, David Jeremiah, is a pastor and national speaker. That man didn't speak but acted.

I also think of another story about a pastor in Canada. A simple man in his church was mute, but that didn't stop him. He took flashcards with the gospel on them and went house to house, allowing the people to read the cards. It is said that more people were in that church because of the mute man than all the ones that could speak.

It isn't our ability to speak that will convince anyone to follow Christ. He has the power to bring them. We are just His spokesman, no matter how incapable we may be. JUST OPEN YOUR MOUTH OR PULL OUT YOUR CARDS.
